Capri, O'Coque and Double q fascinated the Germany

Unique and exciting design, style and finishes of Made in Italy have fascinated the Germany and brought, the editor of the **Deutsches Uhrenmuseum**, the Clock Museum in Furtwangen in the Black Forest, to include three **Progetti** cuckoo clocks in the valuable collection and catalog: **Capri** and **Double q** design Alberto Sala, **O'Coque** by Dario Serio.



The Museum, founded in 1852 and located in the heart clock industry, with more than 60,000 visitors a year, provides a deep insight and full of history, traditions and culture of clocks and cuckoos at the international level; displays objects more than 150 years old among which stand out for their originality, color and fun Progetti's objects whose mechanisms are precisely produced in the region of the Black Forest.

The current museum collection, based on extensive research, including wristwatches, table, wall and cuckoo clock, a repository of business documents and publications, infact has more of 8,000 items, offering visitors a broad portrait of the evolution of the industry.

Today, as before, the clock and the cuckoo are not simply useful items but they are something more: they are real home accessory, an expression of taste and style that characterizes an environment.

Progetti, for over thirty years, is a reference point in the market thanks to a constant analysis of trends and consumer needs, careful research of new materials and functions to make their products unique.
